Mr. Singleton,

On December 20, 2012, one **Kellie N. Johnson**, age 32 (DOB 3/1/80), of 250 Victor Ave., Dayton, OH 45405, voluntarily appeared at the office of Tri-State Polygraph Associates Inc. to be examined on the polygraph a detection of deception technique.

Previous arrangements for this examination were made by Mr. David Singleton, Executive Director of the Ohio Justice and Policy Center.

The purpose of this examination was to ascertain if Kellie N. Johnson was being truthful in statements she made concerning her involvement as well as Tyra Patterson's involvement in the murder of Michelle Lai in Dayton, Ohio that occurred on September 20, 1994.

Following the pre-test interview which commenced at 10:31 a.m. on December 20, 2012, the examinee was asked the following specific questions followed by her answers to them.

- Q Were Tyra and Rebecca gone from the scene when Michelle was shot?  
A Yes  
Q Did Tyra snatch a necklace from anyone in the Chevette?  
A No  
Q Did Tyra participate in the robbery of the victims in the Chevette?  
A No

Q Did Tyra try to stop the robbery of the victims in the Chevette by telling the shooter to leave the girls alone?

A Yes

After careful interpretation of **Kellie N. Johnson's** polygraph tracings, it is my opinion there was **No Deception Indicated** on her answers to the pertinent questions.
